Application deadlines	Until Mai 15th for the first semester or full year Until November 15th for the second semester
Specifications	We accept both undergraduate and graduate students. Depending on the department, some Master 1 & 2 courses are not open to exchange students. All the common fields are open except for the Medicine department, unless specified in the agreement.
Number of students	It depends on the agreement signed between our universities.
Language requirements	A <b>B1 level in French is required</b> and a <b>B2 level is highly recommended</b> . Students who are French native speakers do not need to submit the language proficiency test.
	- DELF Diploma (https://www.ciep.fr/en/delf-tout-public) of the current year: B1 may be accepted level but it is strongly recommended to get B2 level
	- TCF test certificate (http://www.ciep.fr/en/tcf/index.php): B1 level may be accepted but it is strongly recommended to get B2 level
	Please note that for the programs: Lettres modernes, LLCER Anglais, LLCER espagnol, LEA, Histoire, Géographie and Sciences de l'éducation students need to be proficient in French and get at a B1 level ( <b>DELF Diploma</b> ) in French language, in accordance to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages CEFR* to follow courses in "Licence" (Undergraduate) and a B2 <b>(DELF Diploma)</b> for "Master" (Graduate) courses.
	Note: Students who are native speakers do not need to submit the language proficiency test.

Preparatory Language Courses (only for exchange students & free)	One French intensive week (18 hours) at the beginning of each semester. Groups are formed according to level (A2 to C1 in accordance with the CECRL) following an assessment test. USPN also offers French classes throughout both semesters. <u>https://www.univ-paris13.fr/espace-langues/</u>
Credits	Please note that a student can get 30 credits (= ECTS - European Credit Transfer System) for a full semester, and 60 credits for a full year. The number of credits required to validate the mobility will be fixed by the sending institution and the student.
Application	The students will receive a link in order to apply as soon as the home university will nominate them by email.
Relevant documents	Learning agreement, Official transcripts of academic records, statement of purpose, letter of recommendation from the course leader, a proof of French proficiency, Curriculum vitae, Copy of Passport, student card from your university

Orientation	A welcome meeting is organized at the beginning of each semester, followed by the French Intensive class
	Please note that we propose the Tandem program: language and cultural exchange program which also allow the international student to meet and exchange with French students.

Insurance	- Exchange students will have to be insured (accident, disease, civil responsibility).
	- Students under 28 have to subscribe to the student social security (free of charge).
