Tuition fees	There is no tuition fee at the university for exchange students from partner universities.  Students have to pay <b>EUR 122.20</b> per semester to student services (Studierendenwerk Stuttgart). This includes European students (incl. ERASMUS-students).

Costs are approximately EUR 105.00 per month.  European students:  European students need the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) from their insurance company in their home country.

# WELCOME DAYS

Students must attend the orientation week (1st week of September / 1st week of March)

### • ATTENDANCE

Students must attend 80 % of the classes in order to receive the required ECTS and mandatory English courses if advised to. Otherwise the International Office is compelled to inform the coordinator at the home university and students may not be allowed to participate in the final exams.

#### PUNCTUALITY

Students must be on time for the classes and other appointments with staff members.

# BEHAVIOUR

Students must behave in a proper manner during their stay at DHBW Stuttgart (during lectures and in their free time, in the dorms, especially). Students have to be aware that they represent not only themselves, but also their families, their university and their home country, as well as DHBW Stuttgart.

# • RELIGIOUS CEREMONIES
